Proposed Action Description:

B1.15 - Support buildings

Multiple aging change house facilities are in need of major renovation and no change house exists on the west end of Y-12, near the new Uranium Processing Facility and other west end production buildings. This facility will provide for forecast capacity for restroom, shower, locker, etc. in an air conditioned and heated building with greater than 20-year lifespan. Installation will require some excavation and clearing, design activity, utility tie ins, some minor parking area, etc. The building will be approximately 20,000 square foot pre-engineered metal building with concrete floors. Contamination in the area will require support from radcon, industrial hygiene, and other programs.

The scope of a proposal must include the consideration of connected and cumulative actions, that is, the proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or §1021.211 of this part concerning limitations on actions during EIS preparation.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
