Proposed Action Description:

This NEPA document would be considered an "umbrella" document for Pantex Plant projects pertaining to safety, health, and environmental improvements. Additional NEPA documentation providing greater project detail would be submitted for individual projects and would be tiered from this umbrella document. Evaluations by the Radiation Safety Department (RSD) and Air Compliance of the Environmental, Safety, and Health Division (ES&H) would be required for any projects involving systems that would increase or decrease the potential emissions of radionuclides and/or other chemicals (carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, particulate matter, and hazardous air pollutants) to the atmosphere.

The types of activities within the scope of this review would be:

- -Modifications of an existing structure to enhance workplace habitability
- -Installation of, or improvements to, building and equipment instrumentation
- -Safety and environmental improvements to a facility, including replacement and upgrade of facility components that do not result in a significant change in the expected useful life, design capacity, or function of the facility, and during which operations may be suspended and then resumed.
