Proposed Action Title: NEPA 4953, Security Infrastructure Revitalization Program (SIRP)

Proposed Action Description:

The Security Infrastructure Revitalization Program (SIRP) is a multi-year, two-phased project to revitalize two quadrants of the perimeter intrusion detection and assessment system (PIDAS) at the Y-12 National Security Complex (Y-12). In conjunction with the current West End Production Area Reduction project, the SIRP project would assure the sustainment for the remaining sections of PIDAS and provide a reliable protection posture (i.e. satisfies DOEO 473.3A) at Y-12. The proposed action for these protection enhancements would include: a refresh of Quadrant 1, a replacement of a portion of Quadrant 2, the reconfiguration of a security post to incorporate the vehicle/pedestrian portal within the perimeter, and the installation of vehicle barriers. The scope of the work includes:

- Site preparation includes: demolition of PIDAS fencing, structures, and security buildings; utility disconnects/re-routes/modifications; and road construction.
- Re-route major utilities (includes storm drains and sanitary sewer lines) and communications infrastructure demolition, installation, or
- 3. Replace and reconfigure vehicle and pedestrian lanes for a passive vehicle barrier system.
- 4. Design and construct/refurbish two PIDAS quadrants to meet DOE O 473.3A
- 5. Replace existing PIDAS components that have or will reached their life expectancy.
